

Scenario : One trauma patient who is pulseless and breathless.

1. One EMS provider
 - a. Assume Medical Command
 - b. Inform KCF-415 that you are on-scene
 - c. Perform medical evaluation
 - i. If situation is significantly different than dispatched or patient is critical, then Communicate status to KCF-415 for relay to ambulance.
 - ii. If situation requires additional personal, notify KCF-415 that additional medical personal are requested on scene.
 - iii. If situation requires extrication, request KCF-415 tone Halifax Fire Company
 1. Inform what equipment may be needed or
 2. Describe entrapment
 - d. Develop scene plan (in head, silently)
 - i. Scene management
 - ii. Extrication (if needed)
 - e. Operate as Medical Provider and IC
 - f. If patient is pulseless and breathless;
 - a. Confirm no spontaneous respirations for one minute AND
 - b. no auscultable or palpable heart beat for two minutes AND
 - c. pupils that are fixed, dilated and non-reactive.
 - g. Note time, secure scene and treat as crime scene
 - h. Remove personnel from vicinity of the scene – establish scene boundary
 - i. Contact Medical Control – describe situation, request instructions
 - j. Request Halifax Constable and VT State Policy from KCF-415
 - k. Establish scene log and check in sheet
 - l. Look for additional patients and full scope of incident scene
 - a. If additional patients are present
 - b. Extricate, treat, transport.
 - c. Preservation of potential crime scene is secondary to patient care. As a courtesy to other agencies, strive to minimize impact to primary scene and any evidence.
2. Two or More EMS providers
 - a. One provider is designated to protect scene boundaries
 - b. One provider to maintain check-in list
 - c. One provide to maintain Incident Command until relieved by police officer
 - d. Additional duties
 - i. Establish a staging area for additional responders and vehicles away from scene
 - ii. Establish traffic control points
